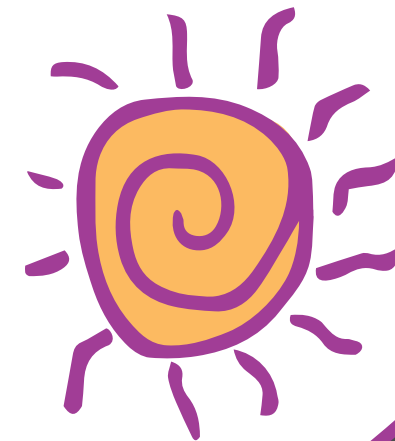

Residential Services

Imagine losing your family and everything you own in one day! Last year, this was a reality for 86 children. They came to the Children's Center scared, alone and struggling.

Our staff provided them with:

- 24 hour care
- Clothing
- 1,095 warm meals
- Assistance with homework
- Transportation to 1,500 medical, dental and mental health appointments
- Support for school and community activities

We made memories one day at a time; making our house their home!

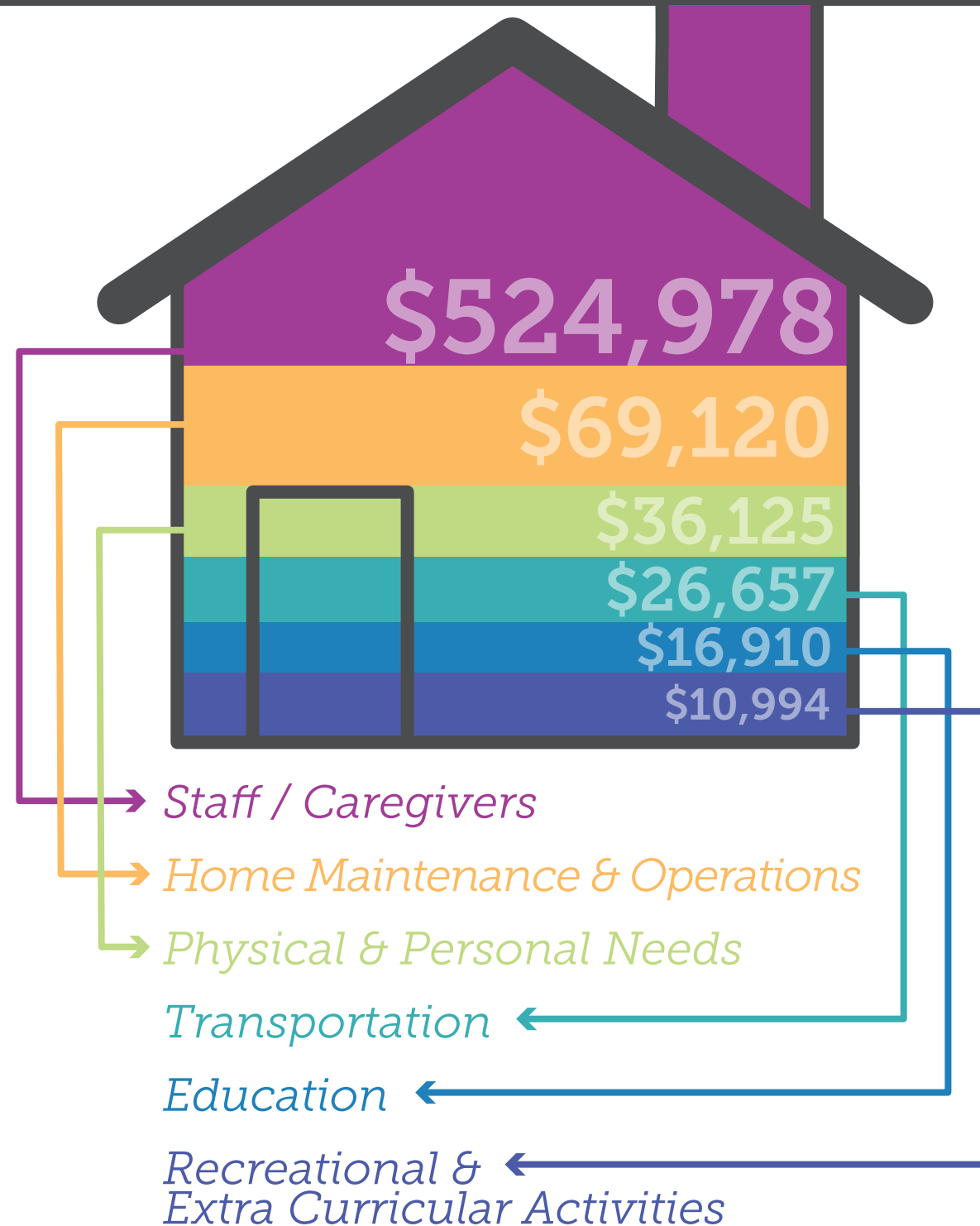

Our youth programs served over 182 children. The Children's Center worked with youth and their families to help them stay in school and make positive choices. Through these programs, the staff prepared them for the "real world" by providing resources to help them get ready for their future and become self-sufficient.

Family Programs

Strengthening Families and Incredible Years are two evidence-based programs that the Children's Center provides that have a long-term impact on the lives of the children and families we serve. Childcare and transportation were provided for 76 families who attended the 16-week programs. Families received 1,216 warm meals and over 3,040 hours of parenting skills.



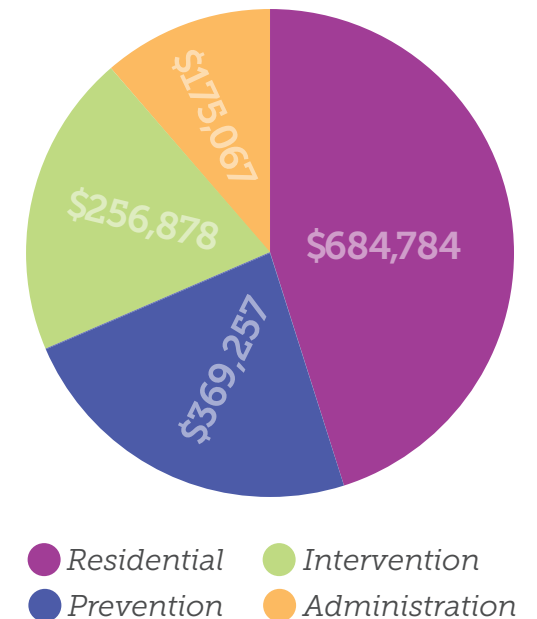
Since many of the families served struggle to make ends meet, each week, they could take home extra necessities like food, school supplies, gloves, hats, and socks. Local schools in Surry and Yadkin Counties hosted the classes.

Community Collaboration

Raising children can be difficult in any circumstance, but parenting while homeless is a real life struggle for many Surry County families. The Children's Center provided 120 parents and their children weekly parenting support and education in 2 homeless shelters in Elkin and Mt. Airy. Follow-up support with families occurs even when they relocate to a home of their own.

Parenting Programs

No matter how bad home can be, children want to stay with their own family. That is why we offer the Nurturing Parenting Program and Parents as Teachers. Our trained parent educators work with parents in their home environment, which allows them to know the family, the children, and the home and provide the necessary parenting skills, support, and resources. Parenting support for 187 parents prevented their children from outside the home placement.



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
